He is now runs a huge business worth crores, while pursuing studies at school! The Dabbawalahs have been around for several decades. But no one thought of using them for courier! Seems so simple.

This approach is called out-of-the-box thinking. It means applying your thinking by asking yourself, "Can this be done differently?" There are so many areas in our daily life which can be improved. You can take up one of them and apply your mind intensely.

Chances are the next big idea will bear your name! All the best.

Dr Homi Jehangir Bhabha



Dr Homi Jehangir Bhabha (30 October 1909 – 24 January 1966) was an Indian nuclear physicist, founding director, and professor of Physics at the Tata Institute of Fundamental Research (TIFR). Colloquially known as "father of the Indian nuclear programme", Bhabha was also the founding director of the Atomic Energy Establishment, Trombay (AEET) which is now named the Bhabha Atomic Research Centre in his honour. TIFR and AEET were the cornerstones of India's development of nuclear weapons, which Bhabha also supervised as director.
