On **November 5** our school children participated in State Level Open Yoga Championship held at Doddaballapur, and secured Runner up Trophy and as well as individual trophies in various age categories



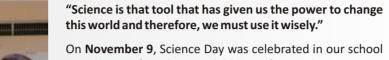
CISCE Seminar at Tiruvanantapuram
