How Good is Your Command?

Command over spoken and written English is a prerequisite if you are aspiring for success in professional courses and subsequently to become a valued professional.

There are at least two basic foundations of the English language, viz., grammar and vocabulary. Without these two pillars, it is impossible to express yourself adequately.



Let us start with grammar. Grammar is the science behind the construction of the language. While grammar is generally not taken seriously by most of us, it is indeed important since it allows us to engage in communication with one another through accepted methods.

When you have grasped the basics of grammar, you can toy with the language with freedom and give wings to your expression.

Equally important is vocabulary. Vocabulary means knowledge of words. The more words you know, the better becomes your quality of expression. Imagine you are narrating an incident. You want to describe the situation. Without usage of the right words, you will feel handicapped. Surely, you must have felt this several times. We often use gestures to make up for loss of right words.

Improving the vocabulary is a core priority for today's students. Tomorrow's world can bring more challenges and opportunities. And these may involve networking or co-working with people from across the world, in which case one must be prepared. Vocabulary built from school level can be a great advantage.

To improve vocabulary, one must make a conscious effort to learn and use words. One simple suggestion is to learn 5 new words everyday. This must be a continuous process irrespective of the class you are in. Make it a part of your daily activity list. Before you get to bed at night, remind yourself about the 5 new words for the day. If you have done that, recollect them.

With the basic foundations of grammar and improved vocabulary, you get the confidence in your communication abilities. With good communication skills, several doors of opportunity open up.

Get started right away. And if you already have, keep up the tempo. All the best!

Club Inauguration


